1959 Winter Meeting of the American Nuclear Society, November 4–6, 1959—Washington, D. C.

President of the American Nuclear Society, Dr. Chauncey Starr, recently announced the appointment of Dr. C. R. McCullough as the Honorary Chairman of the Washington meeting. Dr. George L. Weil was named General Chairman of the meeting. Dr. Urner Liddel is in charge of local arrangements. Mr. Howard G. Hembree of the U. S. AEC is Treasurer of the meeting. Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania (Walter Esselman, Chairman).
