Chicago, Illinois (J. M. Harrer, Chairman). On June 4th, 350 members and guests heard a panel discussion, moderated by L. Reiffel, Vice-Chairman of the Chicago Section, on the "Hazards of Radiation." Discussed was the current status of knowledge on the biological and genetic hazards of

radiation in relation to nuclear weapons testing and other sources of radiation such as X-ray machines. Panel members were: Dr. John Cooper, Northwestern University Medical School; Dr. Miriam T. Finkel, Argonne National Laboratory; Dr. Clifford W. Gurney, University of Chicago, Argonne Cancer Research Hospital; Dr. Frank R. Hendrickson, University of Illinois Medical School, Presbyterian and St. Luke's Hospitals; and Dr. William T. Norris, Argonne National Laboratory.

Eastern Idaho (Sol Sandhaus, Chairman). Mr. Earl S. Grimmett of the Chemical Engineering Development group at CPP, was the featured speaker after a smorgasbord dinner meeting held April 21. Mr. Grimmett's topic was "Fission Product Disposal."

Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania (W. H. Esselman, Chairman). On April 21, members of the Pittsburgh Section heard Mr. John J. Kearney, Assistant Managing Technical Editor of the magazine Electrical World, present a "nonpartisan" comparison of the economic outlook of the entire power industry, including both conventional and nuclear fuels. Mr. Kearney's pres-

entation entitled "A Critical Examination of the Economic Future of Various Energy Sources," was of great interest to the management and technical personnel of many industries producing conventional fuels as well as to persons connected with the nuclear business. The meeting was selected as an event in the science activities of the Pittsburgh Bicentennial Celebration.

As a service to local section members, and a continuing part of the educational activities of the Section, the Membership and Education Committees of the local section have made arrangements with *Nucleonics* magazine for reduced group rates. An important feature of this plan is that the normal salesman book commission will be made available to the Pittsburgh Section in the form of technical books suitable for high school science teachers and students.
