The Board of Directors thanked Dr. Beckerley for his "unique, selfless, and successful service to the Society."

## The Hot Laboratories Division Conference, San Francisco, December 12–14, 1960

As such, it will run concurrently with the meeting of the Atomic Industrial Forum and with the "Atom Fair," an exhibit of scientific and technological equipment of interest to the Atomic Energy industry. The Conference on Hot Laboratories and Equipment will be the eighth of a continuing series of symposia held more or less annually and designed to foster the spread of information pertinent to the design, construction, and operation of laboratories, buildings, facilities, and specialized equipment used in the handling of radioactive material.
