This volume is the first compilation of organizations dealing with echnology transfer that this reiewer has ever seen. The book, as see it, would be of little interest to rederal technology utilization protram managers. However, the book should serve as a useful tool for the private inventor or the company acting as intervenor for the inventor. If his volume encourages and promotes echnology transfer, it will have nerved a very useful purpose.

Any book of this type is out of date at printing and this one is no exception. No attempt should be made to keep it updated. I disagree with the author on the point that a product must result before technology is transferred; for example, a transfer occurs when one company adopts another's better or less expensive method or methods of producing an already marketed product.

At best, at the time of printing the book represents a compilation of companies active in technology transfer as a service industry.

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
